How to Use This Playbook

This document is a social media playbook for the 2022 Teen Driver Safety campaign. It includes specific content and assets, along with instructions, for teens and teen organizations to use. The content in this playbook is designed for easy posting and use on your social media accounts. Posting these messages may save lives.

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Campaign Overview

Campaign Summary

Motor vehicle crashes remain the primary cause of death for teens between the ages of 15- and 18-years-old in the United States. While many teens understand the risks that come with driving, it is important for parents to reinforce the **#RulesForTheRoad**.

This campaign emphasizes seven key target behaviors that teens should practice:

1. Wear a seat belt and make sure all passengers do as well
2. No speeding
3. No distractions
4. No extra passengers
5. No alcohol
6. No drugs
7. No impairment-causing medications

In addition to these target behaviors, the campaign also seeks to have teens serve as role models for friends and other teens in their communities. We know teens listen to their friends, so we hope to spread these safe-driving messages among teens on social media. These messages can also be used by organizations on their social media channels to help make a difference, widening the reach of safe-driving messages to more teens.

Objectives

- Educate teens on the risk factors of driving
- Motivate teens to practice safe-driving behaviors on the road
- Encourage teens to share safe-driving behaviors with their peers

While we include tips in this playbook, our number-one recommendation is that you make sharing these safety messages authentic for yourself or your organization. Authenticity is the best way to educate and persuade people on social media.

Posting Strategy

Teen Driver Safety is a year-round campaign that can be promoted at any time. There are always new teen drivers on the roads who need to be aware of the risks they may face. This content can be worked into your existing content stream at any time throughout the year.

One week to especially emphasize teen driver safety is Teen Driver Safety Week from October 16–October 22, 2022. While Teen Driver Safety messaging can be used throughout the year, this week is a particularly relevant time for everyone to amplify the campaign.

There are some conventional periods, like prom, graduation or homecoming, when teens are often driving themselves and this safety message is more pertinent than ever. A concentrated effort to share safe-driving messages around these events may reach more teens.

Post Talking Points

When posting about being a safe driver and responsible passenger, please use the messages in this playbook as a guide. Here are some talking points for teens to incorporate into original content on social media:

- I wear my seat belt and make sure all my friends do too.
- I always follow the speed limit—you should too.
- I leave my phone out of sight, so I'm not distracted. Follow my lead!
- I don't pack my car full of friends because it can be a distraction.
- Drinking and driving don't mix—stay sober behind the wheel.
- I don't do any kind of drugs before I get behind the wheel—neither should you.

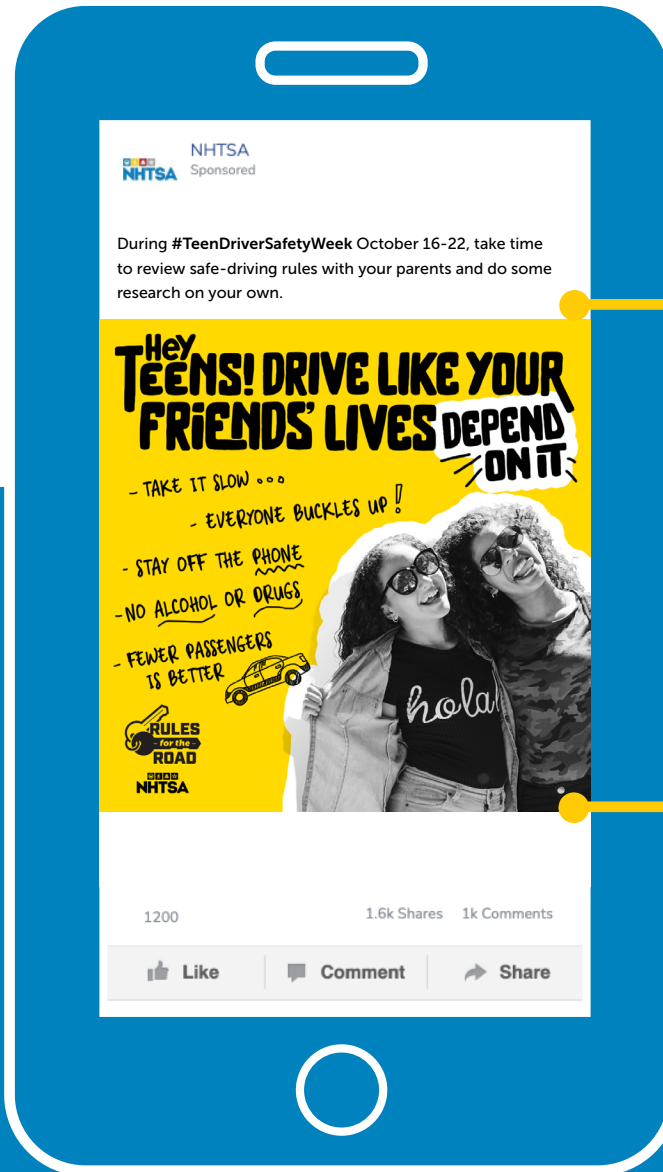

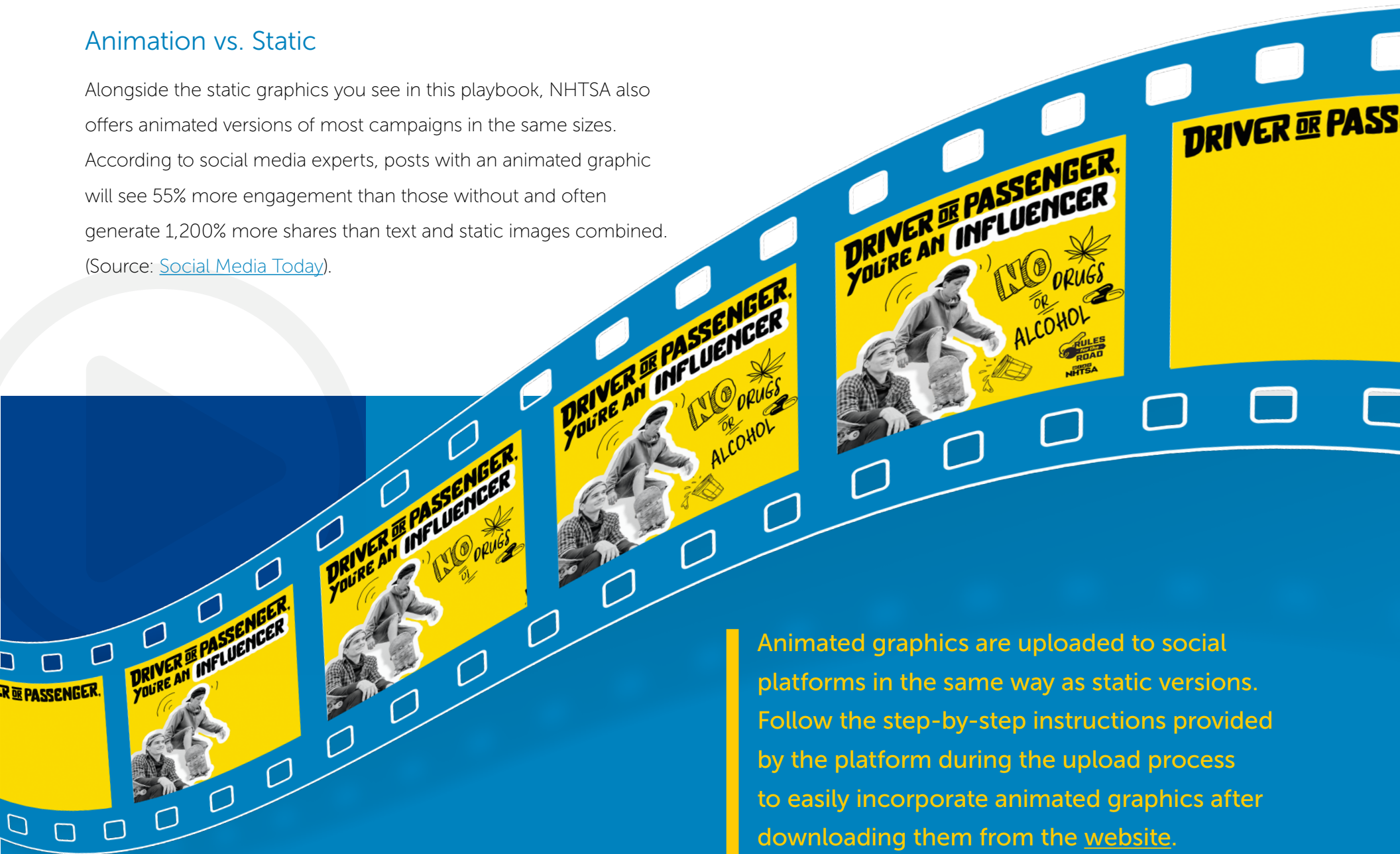
